As well as presenting panel discussions throughout the day, tees valley arts would like to invite you to a day packed with arts events. There is no need to register for any of these events and all are free. Just drop in!

- 11.45am** small world: Big Drums, a music performance group with people of mixed abilities playing and writing their own compositions.
- 12.15pm** Carpet Films present the work of **Shout Your Mouth Off**, Hartlepool based disabled people's film-making company
- 1.00pm** Poetry Performance by contributors of **Kenaz**, a free magazine showcasing cutting edge, contemporary writing, design, illustration and artwork from the Tees Valley. Performers today include Andy Willoughby and Phil Cooper.
- 1.30pm** **You are Here** : a presentation about a short film and education pack made with year 5 children in a Cromwell School, Middlesbrough. It explores themes of refuge, change of country and cultures and new arrivals.
- 5.15pm** **Performance: Maurice Dezou**, originally from Ivory Coast and **Steve Wright**, professional musicians based in Middlesbrough and London respectively. They play a variety of instruments in traditional and modern styles, and create enjoyable music which reflects the new fusion of world music here on Teesside.
- 5.50pm** **Performance: Ahmed Adnan and Imad Alsadi** are from Egypt and Palestine respectively, now living on Teesside; they play guitar, oud and drums. They were involved in the **tees valley arts** Diaspora group, and now play together at concerts and events all over the North East. Their music is a fusion of traditional and contemporary Arabic styles.
